

FACT SHEET

ANGOPHORA FLORIBUNDA | 'ROUGH BARKED APPLE'



- Origin:** This species is found in coastal regions, tablelands, and western areas of NSW, Victoria and Queensland.
- Habit:** A large, wide, spreading tree growing to a height of between 15 and 18m over 40 years.
- Description:** Medium to large evergreen tree with broad, dome canopy, generally gnarled-looking at maturity. Leaves narrow sickle-shaped, 10-15cm long, 1.5-3cm wide, dark green above and paler below. Flowers in dense clusters. Rough fibrous and furrowed light brown bark.
- Tolerances:** Prefers full sun, smaller in shade. Moderate drought tolerance with no obvious signs of stress in an average summer. Widely planted in urban areas and generally grows satisfactorily. And can be damaged by frost when young.
- Notes:** Flowering is normally in the spring and summer. Flower colour is a creamy white. Found in coastal locations on sandy and alluvial soils on both slopes and flats. Widely planted and adaptable to a range of soil and climatic conditions.
