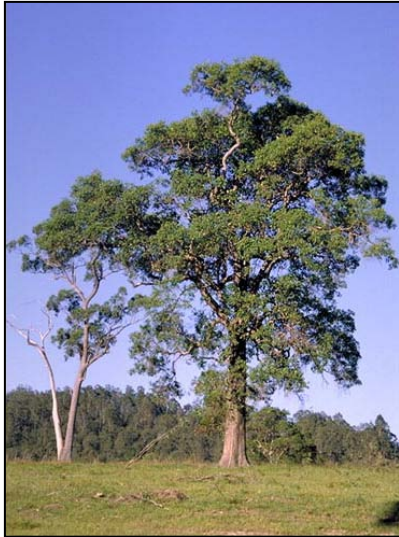


FACT SHEET

ANGOPHORA SUBVELUTINA | 'RED APPLE'



Origin: Eastern Australia

Habit: Tree to 20m high with dense crown and persistent rough, flaky bark leaves broad at base with very short leaf stalk.

Description: Fruit is hard, woody, ribbed capsule to 10 mm long, releasing seeds at maturity. Growing to a height of 10 – 15 metres over 40 years. The bark is rough and scaly. The leaves are dark green. The creamy white flowers grow in large inflorescences.

Tolerances: High tolerance to drought; grows well with no obvious signs of stress.

Notes: Flowering has been recorded in December, January and February. Part of the Angophora species, one of 10 trees or large shrubs in the myrtle family.
