FACT SHEET



CALLISTEMON SALIGNUS | 'WILLOW BOTTLEBRUSH'





Origin: QLD and NSW

Habit: Large shrub or small tree to 3-7 m tall, and a width of <5m

Description: Leaves are bright green, narrow and tapering at both ends 6-9cm long, 0.5-1.5cm

wide, new foliage growth is bright purple/pink. Flowers are creamy-white bottle brushes 4-5cm long, 3-3.5 cm wide appearing in Spring to Summer. The trunks are

also attractive, paper – barked, and typically a mix of cream and tan.

Tolerances: Water logging and moderately drought tolerant.

Notes: Will grow up to 1200mm per year and form an excellent weeping canopy within 5

years..
