ANGOPHORA COSTATA - 'SMOOTH - BARKED APPLE'

Foliage

Origin: Occurs from South Queensland to New South Wales on coastal heaths and open

woodland.

Habit: Large evergreen tree. Though form may vary, generally occurs as densely foliaged

with a broad domed crown. A fast growing species that can attain dimensions of

15-18 x 10- 13 at maturity over a 40 year period

Description: Young leaves appear reddish, maturing to mid – green. Flowers are creamy – white

appearing in December to January; very attractive. Bark smooth rusty – red, also

very attractive.

Tolerances: An adaptable species, it is highly tolerant of drought though sensitive to

waterlogging. Prefers full sun. Generally free of serious pests and diseases.

Notes: Formative prune to develop strong structure. A very handsome tree for urban areas. Suitable

for planting under powerlines as it responds well to pruning.
