LOPHOSTEMON CONFERTUS |



'QUEENSLAND BRUSH BOX'



Origin: Coastal forests from Northern NSW to North Queensland.

Habit: Moderate to fast growing medium sized evergreen tree typically developing a single

trunk and rounded to pyramidal canopy, In southern Australia mature dimension of

about 10-15 m in height x 6-12 m width can be expected.

Description: Leaves thick, dark green and glossy above, paler beneath to 15cm long. Flowers are

white,occurring in 3's. Fruit is a woody bell shaped capsule to 1cm. Bark is smooth, sometimes lustrous, beige coloured, seasonally peeling in flakes revealing coppery

orange to brown tones.

Tolerances: Adapts to most soil types. Grows well in urban areas. Tolerates a wide range of soils

Moderately tolerant of drought, frosts, aerial slat spray and air pollution.

Notes: Moderate to long lived species. Rarely requires formative pruning to develop good

branch structure. Responds well to pruning. Fire retardant. Generally free of any serious pests or diseases. Flowers attract bees. Good street tree or modest sized

specimen tree for parks.
