FACT SHEET **CORYMBIA MACULATA (SYN. EUCALYPTUS MACULATA)** | , 'SPOTTED GUM'







Origin: South-east Queensland and coastal New South Wales.

- Habit:Large evergreen tree, normally with a long, single straight trunk supporting a dense,
broad domed canopy. Fast growing it can attain dimensions of 12-15m high x 10-
12m wide at maturity. Over a 30 year period.
- **Description:** Slightly glossy leaves are mid-green above and lighter green below. White flowers borne in May through September. Smooth barked with spotted or mottled various shades of grey.
- **Tolerances:** Adaptable to a wide range of climatic conditions and soil types, though prefers well drained sites. High drought tolerance and high pollution tolerance.
- **Notes:** Requires formative pruning yet makes a handsome large tree. Suitable for avenues or on large sites planted in groups.
